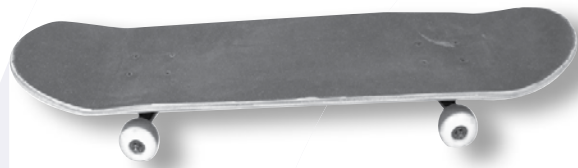

Reuse Options

Reusing—whether you donate, buy or sell—is one of the best ways to reduce waste. If you are cleaning out your closets, drawers, attic or garage this spring, here are some resources (in addition to well-known organizations such as Goodwill and Salvation Army) to help you find a second home for your clothing, books and other household items. Reusing items conserves energy, natural resources and landfill space.

Freecycle

The Freecycle Network™ is probably the most well known of the grassroots efforts to keep good, re-usable stuff out of landfills. Everything posted must be offered at no charge. Safe Medication Disposal and Thermometer Exchange

At Arbor Day Celebration Saturday, March 14, 11 am to 1 pm
Pioneer Park, Church Street (near Castro Street behind City Hall)

- Bring old and unwanted prescription pills, drugs and other medications for safe and proper disposal (no controlled substances). Place medicines in original containers in zip lock bags.
- Swap old mercury thermometers for less toxic ones while supplies last. Place old thermometers in a zip lock bag separate from medicines.
- No other hazardous waste will be accepted.

New Construction and Demolition Ordinance

The City's new Construction and Demolition Debris Diversion (C&D) Ordinance went into effect January 1, 2009. The ordinance applies to all construction, demolition and renovation projects of 5,000 square feet or more and requires diverting at least 50% of the project debris from the landfill through salvage and recycling practices. How to Recycle at Home

Household Batteries

Place used batteries in the bag provided by Foothill Disposal and set on top of cart. Foothill will empty it and return the bag to you for reuse. (Please put tape over battery terminals to reduce the risk of fire. Spent batteries may have enough voltage remaining to start a fire.)

Mixed Containers (Blue Lid)

Place glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and wide-mouth tubs #1 through #7, metal cans and metal lids in the cart under the blue lid.

Paper (Grey Lid)

Put newspaper, mixed paper, food boxes and small cardboard pieces in the cart under the grey lid.

Used Motor Oil and Filters

Put used motor oil and filters in containers provided by Foothill Disposal and set on top of the curb.

Cardboard

Cut large cardboard into pieces about 3'x3' and place on top of curb.

Extra yard trimmings and recycling

If you *regularly* have extra recycling or yard waste, order a larger or second cart (no charge). If you *occasionally* need more service, use an On Call Plus Clean Up appointment (no charge) or schedule an extra collection (\$10/cart). Call Foothill Disposal at **650-967-3034**.

Extra garbage

Purchase extra garbage stickers (\$5) from any local Lucky, Safeway, Nob Hill or Rite-Aid stores, the City Library or Finance Department at City Hall. Attach one sticker to each 32-gallon garbage bag and place next to your garbage cart.



Where to Set Out Carts

- 1 Set out all carts **in the street** by 6 am on collection day. Remove carts no later than the next day.
- 2 Place carts in the street **at least 18 inches apart** (for mechanical collection). Keep carts away from overhanging trees, carports and balconies.
- 3 Store the carts inside the garage or behind a fence, hedge, or area screened from street view as a courtesy to your neighbors. If these areas are unavailable, place the carts on the side of the garage or house.
- 4 Do not place carts on top of the curb or on the sidewalk unless there are obstructions such as parked cars or parking is prohibited. In this situation, driver will collect carts from the top of the curb.

WHAT'S RECYCLABLE?

What's accepted?

Paper

- All paper should be clean and without food residue.
- Catalogs, magazines, telephone books (no plastic wrapper)
- Cereal and cake mix boxes (remove all liners)
- Computer and plain fax paper
- Construction or art paper (less than 50% painted)
- Corrugated cardboard boxes (flattened)
- Egg cartons (paper only)
- Gift-wrapping paper and greeting cards
- Junk mail and envelopes (plastic windows okay)
- Manila file folders
- Newspaper and inserts
- Paper (any color), tablet paper and backs
- Paper bags
- Paperback books
- Post-it notes
- Shoe or clothes boxes (flattened)
- Shredded paper (no plastic bag)
- Store receipts (NCR carbonless ok)

Glass Bottles and Jars

- Beverage bottles
- Canning jars
- Jam and peanut butter jars
- Olive oil and vinegar bottles
- Soup and spaghetti jars
- Wine bottles (no corks/wrappers)

Metal Cans

- Aluminum cans
- Bimetal cans (cat food cans)
- Metal food cans and lids
- Steel and tin cans



Plastic Bottles and Tubs #1 through #7

- Baby wipe tubs
- Bakery, deli and salad tubs (no clamshells)*
- Catsup bottles
- Cottage cheese tubs
- Detergent bottles
- Margarine tubs
- Milk jugs
- Peanut butter jars
- Prescription bottles
- Shampoo bottles
- Syrup bottles
- Water, soda and juice bottles
- Yogurt tubs

* Clamshells are containers with a connected lid.

What's not accepted?

Paper

- Any paper that has touched food.
- Beverage cups, coffee cups
- Binder clips (staples and small paperclips okay)
- Donut boxes, fast-food cups, burger wrappers
- Egg cartons (polystyrene foam)
- Foil gift wrap
- Food and candy wrappers, snack or potato chip bags
- Frozen food boxes
- Hardback books
- Ice cream cartons
- Milk, soy, juice cartons or bags
- Paper covered with paint or pet waste
- Pizza boxes
- Plastic-coated papers (photographs)
- Spiral-bound notebooks or vinyl binders
- Tissues, paper towels, paper plates
- Waxed (dark brown) cardboard

Metal Cans

- Aerosol can (empty or full)
- Construction debris, nails, metal pipes or car parts
- Pots, pans and appliances

Glass Bottles and Jars

- Ceramic coffee cups or dishes
- Drinking glasses
- Fluorescent tubes or any light bulb
- Mirrors, picture frame glass, window glass

Plastic Bottles and Tubs

- Any plastic container not marked #1 through #7
- Any plastic container larger than 2-gallons
- Beverage cups, plates, utensils and straws
- Bubble-wrap, shrink-wrap, plastic tarps
- Buckets, laundry baskets, crates, plant pots, pails
- Clamshells (deli, fast-food)*
- Computer disks or "jewel" boxes for disks
- Foam beverage cups, food or meat trays
- Foam packaging, blocks or "peanuts" (Styrofoam)
- Garden hoses or plastic toys
- Lids and caps
- Medical waste (saline bags, needles/syringes)
- Photographs, negatives, microfiche, transparencies
- Plastic bags of any kind even if marked #1 through #7
- Plastic pens, pencils, glue bottles and glue sticks
- Styrofoam
- Toothpaste and ointment tubes



This list may also be used for apartment and business recycling. Check container label to sort recyclables.

For Homes with Split Carts: When is my Collection Day?

Find Your Collection Day/Recycling Week:

- 1 Locate your neighborhood on the map below and note the collection day and color (or use the online street index below*).
- 2 Match the color to the calendar at right for the recycling week (i.e. Grey = Week B). **Example:** On Church Street between Hope and Castro, garbage day is every Tuesday, and recycling day is every other Tuesday starting on January 6 (Week A).

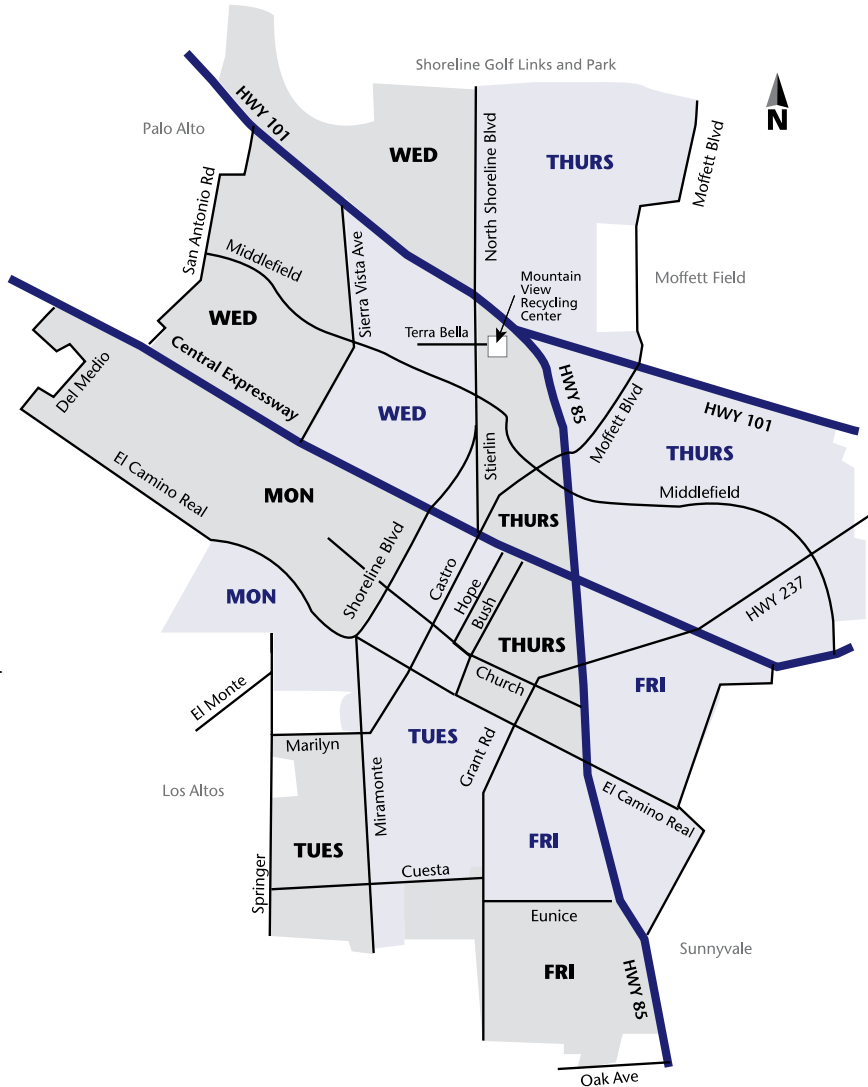
Holidays

Collection occurs on all holidays except Thanksgiving (November 26), Christmas (December 25) and New Year's Day (January 1). If your collection day falls on or after the holiday, collection will occur one day later that week, with Friday collection on Saturday.

Free On-Call Plus Clean Up Program

Residents may schedule 3 curbside collections of extra trash, yard waste and bulky goods by calling Foothill Disposal at **650-967-3034**. Appointments may be scheduled any time before December 18, 2009 and can be used to set out extra material in an 8'L x 4'W x 4'H area PLUS up to 3 bulky goods such as a washer, sofa and mattress at no charge. Appointments may be exchanged for a voucher to self-haul to the SMaRT Station in Sunnyvale. No appointments accepted December 18, 2009 through January 15, 2010.

Household Hazardous Waste Services

Effective February, 2006, California banned consumer electronics and other hazardous waste from the trash. These items cannot be placed in garbage or recycling containers because they contain lead, copper, mercury or chromium that can pollute the environment. The SMaRT Station and the County Household Hazardous Waste Program accept many items without charge. Foothill also accepts many items in the On-Call Plus Clean Up Program without charge, but fees may apply for special handling of refrigerators, computer monitors and television sets.

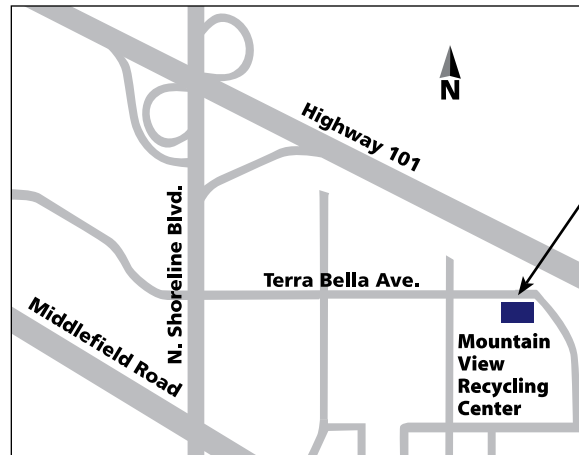

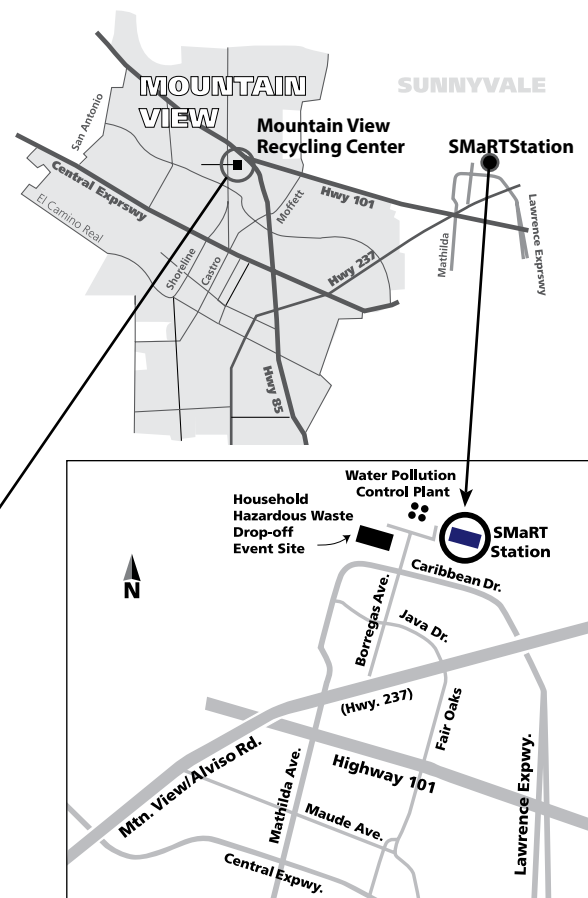

SMaRT Station 301 Carl Road, Sunnyvale

The SMaRT Station is the materials recovery and refuse transfer facility shared by the Cities of Mountain View, Palo Alto and Sunnyvale. In addition to providing buy-back and drop-off services, the Station processes Mountain View's garbage, yard trimmings, and recycling and accepts debris from the public (fee applies). Free compost and mulch may be picked up by residents at the drop-off center.

Hours: Daily 7 days a week 8 am-5 pm.
